


The agency continued to facilitate the implementation of its flagship Rural Enterprise Development (RED) Hubs programme which places rural communities and their organised entrepreneurial organisations at the centre of operations.

AGRO-PROCESSING

- · ECRDA operates five RED Hubs
- Four RED Hubs that focus on grain production and value-addition –Emalahleni in Lady Frere, Mbizana, Ncora, Mqanduli
- ECRDA operates the new flora Tshabo RED Hub in Berlin outside East London
- The RED Hub is introducing and developing a new flora industry in the Eastern Cape.
- Food Safety Policy was developed and implemented at the milling RED Hubs.
- Instore promotions conducted at SPAR branches with substantial success
- Promotions took place at seven SPAR Eastern
 Cape stores
- Promotions aimed at activating RED Hub mill products
- Partnership with Grain South Africa assisted with capacity-building training on tractor and farm implement maintenance
- ECRDA facilitated training and demonstrations on new mobile maize dryers received from the Department of Rural Development and Land Reform (DRDLR)

LIVESTOCK DEVELOPMENT

Central to ECRDA's livestock development strategy, is a clear commitment to encouraging and empowering the province's subsistence and small-scale farmers to become active participants in – and beneficiaries of – emerging livestock markets.

Department of Rural Development and Agrarian Reform (DRDAR) took over running of the livestock development programme. ECRDA facilitated a number of livestock development activities at select feedlots – Zigudu, Mqanduli and Ncorha. These activities included:

R1 million for irrigation system at Zigudu Feedlot

aimed at ensuring that the feedlot is in a position to produce its own feed mixing ingredients in order to curtail feeding costs

STIMULUS FUND

EQUIPMENT AND SEED **R5,2 million**

the procurement of equipment and seed capital for feeder cattle through the use of a R5,2m allocation from the Provincial Stimulus Fund;

awareness campaigns on cattle conditioning, marketing and the purchase of mobile auction pens to be used in various areas of the former Transkei.



These campaigns were attended by close to 500 farmers; educational radio sessions on livestock marketing and condition. These sessions are to be followed by a vernacular newsletter planned for the new financial year, as well as; (v) purchases of cattle for fattening at the feedlots, and facilitating the sales thereof

FORESTRY DEVELOPMENT

The Eastern Cape Rural Development Agency has worked closely with the Department of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries (DAFF) over the past few years to craft a responsive and progressive forestry strategy that places rural and subsistence landowners at the centre of the Eastern Cape's afforestation initiatives.





BUSINESS SUPPORT

The ECRDA continued to provide business support, advisory services and capacity-building to external clients such as co-operatives and to businesses which make up the RED Hubs, feedlot owners, forestry development enterprises and to the communities which the ECRDA services in general.

R265 000

SUBSIDIARIES AND ASSOCIATED ENTITIES

The ECRDA provided financial and technical support interventions to its subsidiaries and associated entities. These entities include the Magwa-Majola Tea Estate, Amajingqi Macadamia Farming as well as the Kangela Citrus Farm. The agency's interventions are meant to improve productivity and competitiveness of these businesses

MAGWA-MAJOLA TEA ESTATE

- Magwa Enterprise Tea (MET) took apositive growth trajectory
- Crop yield of tea rose from 460 tons in 2018/19 to 695 tons in 2019/20
- Projected crop yield of black tea expected to hit 1,400 tons in 2020/21 harvesting season
- MET adopted a new business model which centred around value creation and addition
- Development of intellectual property in the company
- MET procured tea bagging and packaging equipment for sufficient supply of tea bags to its markets
- ECRDA has developed a masterplan intended to be a focal point of all development initiatives around the Magwa and Majola Tea Estates for the next 15 years
- Development initiatives to diversify current focus on tea plantation to other high value crops
- Initiatives to exploit the tourism potential of the area through the development of an ecofriendly tourism valley



AMAJINGQI MACADAMIA FARMING

- · More than 267 ha of macadamia nuts planted
- · Target is to plant 300 ha at full scale
- Harvesting on one variety of the 89ha comprised of three-year-old trees currently bearing the first crop
- Project has made a considerable achievement in creating jobs for the rural people especially the youth
- More jobs to be created once the project operates at full capacity in the coming few years.
